



# **Urangan South Local Area Plan – Survey Results**

## **About the Survey:**

To gauge the community's views on certain topics related to the Urangan South area, a survey was open to the public from the 10<sup>th</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup> August 2018. Council reached out to the community in the following ways:

- 242 letters/factsheet/surveys were sent to landowners in the locality.
- A notice was placed on Council's website.
- Council posted on its facebook page.
- An article about the project was published in the Fraser Coast Chronicle (website and physical newspaper).
- An email was sent to local development consultants in the area.

#### Who responded to the survey?

- 91 survey responses received.
- 68% were homeowner/occupiers in the locality.
- 49% of respondents have owned property in the locality for 10+ years.

### What do you like about the locality?

Larger lot sizes, peace and quiet, large amounts of trees/vegetation.

### What is your opinion on subdivisions in the locality?

- 40% 'strongly disapprove' of the subdivisions.
- 10% 'strongly approve' of the subdivisions.

## What form of residential development would you prefer to see?

- 47% preferred to see larger lot sizes above 2,000m<sup>2</sup>.
- Others either preferred mixed lot sizes (500m<sup>2</sup> to 2000m<sup>2</sup>) or no further residential development.
- Only 5% preferred regular infill lots (500m<sup>2</sup>).

## What do you believe are the most significant constraints for future development?

 Drainage and localised flooding, poor quality of road surfaces/widths, traffic congestion, noise from the airport, native vegetation, limited access to water/sewer infrastructure and odour from the sewerage treatment plant.

# How would you prefer drainage and flooding issues be mitigated?

42% would prefer drainage and flooding issues to mitigated natural environments with a high consideration of visual amenity.

## What would you like to see happen in 10-15 years' time?

Retention of trees and vegetation, improved road surfaces/widths, reduce drainage and flooding issues, less residential development and sewer availability to all properties.
