The most common types of leaks are toilets, taps and underground pipes.

One dripping tap can waste more than 2,000 litres a month.

If your toilet is running constantly, you could be wasting between 20 and 1400 litres of water every day.

The easiest way to find out if you have a water leak is to:

- 1. Check your water meter and take a reading.
- 2. Do not use any water for at least two hours.

Fixing household leaks can save you money.

- 3. Take another reading of your water meter.
- 4. If the meter reading has increased, you most likely have a leak.

Water saving tips

- Make sure you repair your taps and toilets.
- Replace washer seals in your toilets.
- Check tap washers for wear and replace if necessary.
- Make sure your showerhead is fitted correctly.
- Get a licensed plumber to fix any leaks.
