

Breeding Cats

Fraser Coast Regional Council Local Law No.2 (Animal Management) 2011

FACT SHEET

If you breed from your Cat in the Fraser Coast Region, whether it be male or female then you're considered a breeder under the local law and are required to hold a Fraser Coast Regional Council Animal Breeder Approval.



A breeder approval is designed to encourage cat owners on the Fraser Coast to consider their responsibilities and ensure that the oversupply of cats and euthanasia rates are minimised.

Applying for a permit

There are some criteria and additional mandatory documentation that may be required when applying, these can include but are not limited to:

- The breeding cat must be microchipped, and
- Evidence the breeding cat has received all core vaccinations, and
- Written proof of membership with a recognised cat breeding association.

Approval conditions

Once a breeding approval is granted there will be some conditions imposed. These will include but are not limited to:

- Kittens must be sold vaccinated, desexed & microchipped unless an exemption exists.
- Complying with the Breeder Code of Practice.

Compliance with conditions

Council's Community Rangers action complaints and conduct regular patrols across the region.

If your cat is found to be breeding without an approval Council may commence enforcement action; and on-the-spot fines may apply.
