Our goal is to empower your child/student with knowledge of their local natural environment and also, the 'know-how' to be able to help protect it.

This Fraser Coast Regional Council education booklet was developed to align with the information provided on the signage installed in Point Vernon.

This signage has been installed by the Fraser Coast Regional Council to raise awareness about the environmental values of this region and to provide nature-based learning experiences in the following three key areas:

- Marine Turtles
- Shorebirds
- Marine Values (Seagrass Meadows, Coral Reefs, Rocky Shores and Mangroves)

MARINE TURTLES INTERMEDIATE

Harper the Hawksbill Turtle

(Eretmochelys imbricata)

Here's Harper the Hawksbill Turtle, as happy as can be,








Find the sign 'Turtles are in Trouble'

Find the 'Turtles are in Trouble' sign. Have a read and design a poster to bring awareness regarding threats to turtles and how people can help. You could make your poster about one of the other ways people can help protect sea turtles like:

- Properly discarding fishing line, hooks and bait bags and carefully picking up any you find
- Using chemicals around your home wisely and disposing of them properly
- Reducing your boat speed in shallow seagrass and coral reef areas
- Reducing your use of plastic and disposing of it properly
- Preventing your dog from disturbing nesting females, nests and hatchlings






Bird Beak Mask Template


Shore Bird Spy Bingo!

BEACH PROFILE						

Find and read the 'The Understorey: A necessary Mess'. Do some leaf rubbings of the different leaves you find in the understorey

HOW TO DO A LEAF RUBBING:

- 1. Place the leaf on a flat surface
- 2. Cover the leaf with paper
- 3. Slowly, use either crayons, coloured pencils and/or oil pastels and rub it over the top of the paper to see the outline and details of the leaf

WHAT ARE CORAL REEFS?

Coral reefs are underwater ecosystems that are made up of hard and soft corals of many shapes and colours. The largest coral reef system is the Great Barrier Reef. This is more than 2,400 km long! Why are coral reefs important? Coral reefs provide food, shelter and breeding sites for over 25% of all marine species.


