Historical Context	Built in 1909 with guarantee money supplied by the parents.			
Physical Description	Small, rectangular building, formerly lowset, (now highset) on timber stumps. Gable iron roof extending over back and front verandahs. Timber frame, hand adzed posts; external studs; pine vertical tongue and groove internal walls, weatherboard cladding. Back and front verandahs now with rail balustrades (probably added 1930s or later). Front and back steps. Casement windows, window shade with fretwork decoration. Interior unlined. School yard with only minor exotics; camphor laurel, coral tree and fig but no mature arbour plantings.

Statement	The Takura School demonstrates the principal characteristics of an early twentieth-century timber school building constructed in a regional area.

Statement	The Takura School has a special association for the Takura community and the school's former students.
